

Jesus was born of the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem in Judea, Palestine 2000 years ago. His birth marks the beginning of a new era of joy and hope for mankind.

He came from heaven to tell us that God is Our Dear Father who has created us and given us life in this world, and who after our good life and death gives Eternal life with Him in heaven.

In order to prove that Jesus came from God, He worked miracles: He changed water into wine, chased out demons from people, multiplied bread and fish for the hungry, walked



over water, healed the sick, raised the dead, and finally after His own death, rose from the tomb.

He loved people and cared for them especially if they were poor and weak. His teachings were beautiful: to trust God who cares for us more than He cares for the birds of the air; to love one another as He has loved us; that a cup of cold water given in His name would be rewarded; that we should forgive others their mistakes and sins if we are to be forgiven our mistakes and sins; that if we seek to do God's will in all things, God will take care of everything in our lives.

He has taught us by example how to live this life without sin; how to bear patiently rejection and even cruelty of others knowing that God sees everything; to pray with all our heart for the good and happiness of others. He loved children and blessed them. He also said that they should develop their God given talents and gifts so that they could help others and make happy the people they meet.

The important feasts of Jesus celebrated are: Easter and Christmas. On Easter Sunday we rejoice at His rising from the tomb on the third day. This means he is more powerful than death. On Christmas Day, 25th December, we celebrate His birth. His birth announces peace and joy to all people of good will.




William Wordsworth called her "The solitary boast of our tainted race", that is, in spite of all the wickedness and corruption of the human race, we have one pure human being to boast of, Mary!

Mary was sinless. God filled her with His Spirit and protected her from sin so that She could be the mother of his Son, Jesus. She was a simple country girl, but She lived her simple life beautifully by believing in God, and not in herself, and by offering herself to God's plans.

Even when She did not understand, She did not doubt, and






The Bible describes her as the woman clothed with the sun, with crown of stars and moon under her feet, as powerful as an army in array. Jesus gave her to us as his last gift-to be our Mother, who will teach us the ways of God.

She is called the Helper because of her power to assist us overcome temptation and teach us to live pure and sinless lives. She is called Seat of Wisdom, because She was filled with the Spirit of God.

She has over the centuries appeared to people in different countries; in Lourdes, France; in Fatima, Portugal; in Guadalupe, Mexico; in Vallankani, Tamil Nadu and in many other places.

She will help us if we only ask her. We must pray to her to help us remain good and pure, to be loving and helpful to others, growing in knowledge and wisdom.

The important feasts of Mary that we celebrate are 8th December: her Immaculate Conception, i.e., her sinless birth; 15th August; her Assumption, i.e., her going to heaven in body and soul after her death; and 24th May: Mary Help of Christians, i.e., her role as a Motherly helper to all who call on her.



St. John Bosco was born in Turin, Italy in 1815. When he was two years old, his Father died. Then, he was raised by his mother, Mama Margaret. John's future work was inspired by a dream he had at the age of nine. A man of majestic appearance told him: with meekness and charity You will conquer these, Your friends: and a Lady (Mother Mary) just as majestic added: Make Yourself humble, strong and robust.

John Bosco wanted to become a priest, especially to assist Youth. So he left home at a Young age to join the city school. Being bigger than his classmates, he was often the object of much ridicule. After school, he worked as a tailor, a cobbler or a writer, often studying by candle light late into the night.



John Bosco was ordained a priest at the age of twenty-six. He was now called Don(father) Bosco. He immediately began to work with orphans. He not only fed the homeless boys whom he took in but also provided them with opportunities for livelihood skills. He spent long hours teaching them to read and write: he also taught them tailoring and shoe making and quickly set up a printing press. Above all, he created a family atmosphere of trust and caring.

"First tell the devil no rest, and then I'll rest too". Don Bosco used to say to those who urged him to let up in his activity. He was a tireless confessor, a popular preacher and never refused an invitation to preach a mission or a retreat.

Don Bosco had an educational system of his own, which he called 'THE PREVENTIVE SYSTEM' its foundation is reason and religion. In other words, a sense of understanding between teacher and pupil, and an interest that is felt: and secondly, a sense of religion fostered by the sacraments of confession and Holy Communion.

More than a century after the death of Don Bosco, thousands of people have dedicated themselves to the continuation of his apostolic love for Young people all over the world. Their mission is to be 'signs and bearers of God's love to the Young'. He was in 'constant union with God' and he had unlimited confidence in Mary the mother of God, who he considered to be the inspiration and support of his whole work.

The 'Salesians of Don Bosco' is an international society founded by Don Bosco, Catholic priests and brothers who are members of the society work for the development






and education of the Young, especially those most at risk. Through schools, colleges, Technical Schools and Youth Centres in 125 countries, the Salesians of Don Bosco serve all Young people, irrespective of religious differences or social inequalities.

In India, Don Bosco Educational institutions are spread all over the country and are in great demand. The style of education consists in engaging Young people, their parents or guardians and the educators in a family atmosphere. The method adopted is one that was lived and handed down by Don Bosco himself: - 'The preventive System' based on Reason, Faith in God and Loving Kindness.

In Maram we are fortunate to have a Don Bosco Higher Secondary school, college, parish and convent. The Salesians here meet the educational and spiritual needs of the people in Maram. With coming of Salesians in Maram the people of Maram have made great progress especially in the field of education.

Millions are now the past pupils of Don Bosco, all over the world. Many who occupy places or responsibility in different countries are among them. They are proud of their education. The work of this humble priest has grown into a mighty tree. The Salesian Society of the fathers and Brothers have over 17,000 members working in over 125 countries through 2,000 institutions. In India alone there are 2200 Salesians serving the educational needs of our children through over 250 institutions scattered throughout the country.



Maria Domenica Mazzarello, co-Foundress with Don Bosco of the Institute of the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians, was born on 9 May, 1837 in a little village called Mornese, among the hills of Monferrato, Italy.

The simple Christian environment in which She grew up and her life of work and sacrifice from the earliest childhood moulded her frank and energetic character. She became inflamed with divine love for her childhood and felt drawn to make a total consecration to God by a spontaneous vow of virginity.





She first met Don Bosco in October 1864 when he arrived in Mornese with his troop of boys usually referred to as 'urchins' on one of the famous autumn outings. "Don Bosco is a saint, and I feel it", was Mary's immediate and confident intuition on seeing him.


Don Bosco discovered and admired in Mary Mazzarello the simple and beautiful reproduction of the Virgin Help of Christians and of Don Bosco's mother, Mamma Margaret. She was to be a humble and valuable collaborator in his educative work for the welfare of Young girls.

She was a tender mother to her spiritual daughters. She followed them with the eye of a vigilant and expert educator. She accomplished real educative miracles by conquering difficult characters without using the slightest pressure and transforming them into real examples for Youth.

She died on May 14th 1888 at the age of 44. Grace helped from an unknown peasant girl into a saint of world-wide renown and influence.

From those, who in Youth are passionately in love with God are upright and sincere, great things can be expected. Girls interested in offering their lives in an exciting time of love, God and education of Young girls, should contact the sisters at Auxilium, Maram.










As she sew the clothes she would feel the pain our Lord had gone through as the thorns and nails pierced in his head and hands. She wanted to join the convent of cloister sisters so at the age of 12, she approached the convent but due to her small age she was asked to return later. But obedience to her parents She got married to Teodoro a colleague cum friend of his father.

JOAQUINA DE VEDRUNA had 9 children. She became widow at the age of 36. At that time she heard a voice from the crucifix, 'I took you as my spouse.' She started doing works of charity and mercy. Fr. Estaban De Olot, her spiritual director encouraged her to start a congregation. She started her religious congregation on 26th February 1854 with nine Young girls, who had burning desire to work for God and good of humanity. She opened 23 houses in different parts of Barcelona; most of them were for the poor, sick, wounded and education of girls. She died at the age of 72 on 28th August. Her mortal remains are in the first house 'Manso Escorial'. We the sisters of Vedruna carry the fire ignited by our mother Foundress St Joaquina the Vedruna.

CHARISM: Education of girls, Care of the Sick and Pastoral work



During the Marian year of 1954, Pope Pius XII canonized a 15-year-old School boy, giving to the whole world, Saint Dominic Savio.

Born in small town called Riva, near Turin in northern Italy on the 2nd April 1842, Dominic took things seriously from his very early years and understood that he had to keep close to Jesus if he wanted to be happy. This explains his deep love for the Holy Mass. When he made his first communion at the age of seven, he took as his motto "DEATH RATHER THAN





SIN" because he understood quite clearly that the only thing that could separate him from Jesus was sin, and no threat or treat was going to make him commit one.

Dominic also understood very early in his life that the person closest to Jesus is His mother. So we see him very attached to Mother Mary. This is the reason why Pope Pius XII said of him "Dominic Savio is a little giant of sanctity and a real model for Youth of our time".

A person's death reflects his life. Those who keep close to Jesus in life, find Him by their side at the point of death, which is but the door to everlasting union with Him. When Dominic was dying on March 9, 1857, he turned to those who were at his bedside and with a joyful smile, exclaimed: "O what beautiful things I see". Jesus whom he loved with all his heart was already rewarding him for his loyalty.

In an age when we see so many Young people chasing pleasures, even those forbidden by God's law, in a mad search for happiness, it does us good to read the life of one who found this happiness, seeking God.



BL. LAURA VICUNA

Laura Vicuna familiarly known as the Lily of the Andes was born at Santiago, Chile, in 1891. Her mother, left on her own, took her two daughters to Argentina for safety. In 1890 Laura became a boarder at the school of Daughters of Mary help of Christians. The following year she made her first Holy Communion and like Dominic Savio, made the resolutions to love God with her whole being, to mortify herself and to die rather than offend God.

When she came to realize that her mother was living in an immoral situation, she offered herself to the Lord for her

mother's conversion. During the short holidays that she had to spend in the house of Mr. Manual Mora, She courageously preserved her virtue, in spite of the insidious advances of that wicked man.

Exhausted by sickness and sacrifices, She revealed to her mother on the last evening of her life. "Mamma, I am dying. A long time ago I asked Jesus to bring you back to God, and I offered my life for that intention. Mamma, before I die, please give me the joy of seeing you reconciled to God". She experienced this joy before dying on 22nd January 1904.

Laura a pearl of purity, filial love and sacrifice, was beatified by John Paul II on 3rd September, 1988 on the hill of the Youthful beatitudes, near Castel nuovo Don Bosco Asti, Italy. "To Laura I would give two palms:" said the servant of God Don Filipo Rinaldi, "the palm of purity and that of love ... I think that very soon Laura will be one of the greatest glories of Young people gathered in our Salesian Houses".





On Sunday 13th June 1999 a remarkable beatification ceremony took place in Poland. Pope John Paul II beatified a total of 108 martyrs from the Second World War, most of whom died in the prison camps of Auschwitz and Dachau. These martyrs include a Salesian priest from Cracow, Fr. Joseph Kowalski, who was killed at Auschwitz on July 3rd 1942. Just one month later, at another prison camp, five young members of the Salesian oratory of Poznan were guillotined, after a long period of trial and suffering for their faith. The oldest of the five was only 23, the Youngest 20. Each of the new "blessed" has left a brief but telling written phrase for the world to ponder. Fr. Joseph had written his, long before he was called to live it to the point of death: "I will never say that's (suffering for faith) enough". Each of the five boys was given an opportunity to write something just before being beheaded. What was written reflects the joyful depth of faith each had achieved: "Do not cry-we are happy". "I thank God I was born in Catholic faith' it gives me strength to overcome everything". "Dear Mom and Dad do not be sad. In heaven I shall be your intercessor in God's presence". "God has given us the cross, and also the strength to carry it".

 20^{th} century has seen the most atrocious killing of innocent human lives in all of human history. But holiness never fails to astonish us, even in the midst of such evil – and especially when it is such youthful holiness.



PROSPECTUS

It is a co-educational, English medium, private school recognized by BOSEM and COHSEM offering a wide choice of subjects in Science, Commerce and Arts.

Don Bosco Hr. Sec School Maram educates the Don Bosco way. Our only priority is the integral development of every child that steps into the portals of Don Bosco. Ours is an education that values and nurtures the religious, spiritual, intellectual, moral, aesthetic, social and physical growth of each student. We foster "student-student" and "teacherstudent" relationships as the most appropriate model to empower every one of them to develop a sense of purpose and respect for self, others and the environment.

We endeavour to meet the individual needs of students and welcome the contributions they make in using their special gifts and talents. We help to create a safe and happy ambience where all the members of the school community are included, valued and nurtured. All this leads to the pursuit of excellence and an ongoing commitment to learning.

Inspired by the benign and noble teachings of Our Lord Jesus Christ who declared of Himself "I am the Way,

the Truth and the Life," and guided by the moral and educational philosophy of St. John Bosco, Don Bosco Schools India envisions well-formed youngsters who are honest persons and good citizens.

We lay emphasis on an education that is participatory in nature, intellectually competent, multi-skill oriented, value based and socially committed.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Don Bosco School is owned and run by the Catholic religious community. No disrespect should be shown to articles, religious images and worship proper to any religious group. No other form of religious worship will be allowed in the school premises.
- 2. The decision of the Principal shall be final in all the matters of academics, discipline and enforcement of rules. The students are admitted on the clear understanding that they will observe the rules of the school and accept the authority of the Principal/Vice Principal
- 3. Don Bosco is an English medium school. The students and teachers will converse in no other language other than English in the school premises and during other outdoor programmes.
- 4. All students must use their own study materials and are responsible for them. The school does not accept responsibility for loss of books, pens, money, and other personal belongings. Students are not allowed to have



large sum of money or valuable articles with them. If anybody looses any item in the school, they should report the matter to the principal.

- 5. The lost and found articles must be submitted to the Principal's office. The owner could claim it by giving the identity of the object.
- 6. All extra-curricular activities of the school will be held on Saturdays. Students are expected to take part in them without fail.
- 7. Students must have all the required text books within two weeks following admission to the school. No other notebooks are allowed in the school except the school notebook supplied from the school counter.
- 8. Students must be disciplined and polite. They should greet the both teaching and non teaching staff courteously wherever they meet them and respect them in and outside the school campus.

FEES

- 9. The fees, once paid, will not be refunded under any circumstance.
- 10. Fees have to be paid for the whole term by the students who leave the school before its completion.
- 11. Admit Card, Mark Sheet and Certificates will not be issued to pupils who have not cleared arrears in the school.



- 12. Parents must produce the fee receipts as a proof of payment in case of any doubt.
- 13. The school fees are for twelve calendar months. It may be paid in advance or in instalments before the 15th of each month. No reduction is made for absent periods or holidays. No reduction in fees is envisaged on account of the number of children studying in the school. School fees are liable to be revised periodically.

SCHOOL HANDBOOK

- 14. A Handbook is provided to each student at the beginning of the academic year. This has to be maintained in a proper manner throughout the year. Students should fill the Identity certificate, contact of parents and local guardian and other pages of the Handbook correctly within the first week of the commencement of the academic session. The ID page should contain the photograph and all the details asked for therein.
- 15. A written application has to be submitted to the Principal through the class teacher together with the required fine, in case the handbook is lost. The front office will issue a new handbook on submission of the application duly countersigned by the class teacher and the Principal.
- 16. The handbook has to be brought to school daily. A student who does not bring the handbook will be marked absent if he / she is from the Primary / Upper Primary classes and the students of Secondary and Senior Secondary classes will be sent home to bring





the handbook. Such students should bring a note on the following day from their parent / guardian for being marked absent / being sent home.

PUNCTUALITY

- 17. Arrival at the school campus has to be before 8:15 am, 8:20 will be the first bell and assembly will begin at 8:30 am. Students coming after 8:30 am should meet the teacher in-charge and get permission to join the class. Students should not loiter around the school campus after school hours in school uniform.
- 18. Students coming late for seven cumulative days will meet the principal with their parents.

VACATION

- 19. There are two major vacations: Winter Break and Summer Break.
- 20. Students must be present on the Re-Opening Day after every vacation and on the last day before every vacation. Those who fail to do so shall pay a fine.
- 21. Any noisy celebrations on the last day of class within school premises is strictly forbidden.

DAMAGE OF SCHOOL PROPERTY

- 22. Causing damage to school/public property shall lead to fines, suspension, or dismissal from the school. Any damage done to school property must be made good by the pupils.
- 23. All should take an honest pride in keeping their school campus clean.



MEDICAL ASSISTANCE AND HEALTH ISSUES

- 24. Students should be ready to undergo medical test by a doctor, as and when directed by the principal.
- 25. Parents / guardians should inform the school authorities regarding any ailment their child / ward is suffering from in order to provide timely medical assistance.
- 26. Students who are injured should inform the teachers / fellow students. The matter should be brought to the notice of the class teacher and Vice Principal / Principal.
- 27. The school cannot be held responsible for accidents, small or serious, to pupil during their stay in the school or while taking part in sports, study tours and extracurricular activities within or outside the school premises.

USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES AND SOCIAL MEDIA

- 28. Use of mobile phones by students in the campus is strictly prohibited. Confiscated phones will not be returned.
- 29. No books, periodicals, newspapers, pen drives, CDs, other forms of media storage may be brought into the school premises without the principal's permission. Students found with obscene or dangerous books, pictures, etc in their possession or lending them to others are liable to be suspended or expelled.



- 30. Videography and photography are prohibited among students for any school event.
- 31. Students should not indulge in using social media against the institution, teachers, students etc. Anyone violating this rule, shall be suspended, or expelled.
- 32. No matter for publication in newspaper, magazines, or journals other than that those published by the school may be submitted in the name of the school by the students without the permission of the principal.

BEHAVIOUR WITH OTHER STUDENTS

- 33. Ragging and harassment of male/female students of any kind and magnitude inside or outside the school campus will lead to suspension or dismissal from the school.
- 34. Eve teasing, molestation, inappropriate hugging, kissing, causing bodily harm to each other, calling vulgar names/words, comments on girls/boys will be viewed as major misconduct and may result in suspension or expulsion.
- 35. Students involved in fighting/quarrelling, threatening, black mailing etc. in the school or outside the school will be suspended or expelled with parents call and a fine. If there is any disagreement or argument among students, it shall be settled in a peaceful manner with the help of teachers or principal.





ABSENCE, ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- 36. Students with a cumulative attendance of less than 80% will not be allowed to sit for the promotion/final examination.
- 37. Leave for serious religious ceremonies or special occasions must be sought earlier but permission to attend such events will be decided according to the discretion of the principal.
- 38. Students are not allowed to leave the school campus during class hours. Students will go out only with the Student's Pass.
- 39. Absence without prior leave given in writing from the principal for 15 days could be considered as the withdrawal of the pupil from the school and the student's name could be struck of the rolls.
- 40. Bunking/Absence from class is a serious offence. Repeated absentees will be suspended or expelled unless the student corrects himself / herself after having been admonished.
- 41. If a student falls sick during class hours, parent/ guardians will be informed and they must come to take the sick person home. Sick students will not be sent home alone.
- 42. Students leaving during the first two hours of class will be marked absent for the day.
- 43. Late comers must get proper entries made in the late arrival section of the dairy and get the signature of the vice principal/ principal.





- 44. Attendance is compulsory on school functions, programmes, and activities.
- 45. Medical certificate is to be furnished if a child is absent for more than three days on medical grounds.

PROMOTION AND DETENTION

- 46. Promotions are based on the whole year's work performance.
- 47. Bad character can result in the detention of a student regardless of the student's academic performance.
- 48. The results declared after the final examination/ selection examination are final and cannot be reconsidered.
- 49. Students who fail badly may be asked to leave the school as they are either unwilling or unable to study.

EXAMINATION

- 50. Students found using unfair means in the examination will be awarded zero for the particular subject and will be allowed to sit for the rest of the exams only after a parents call. It can also lead to the dismissal from the school.
- 51. No one is allowed in the examination hall without the Admit Card. Examinations written without the admit card will be considered invalid. (exception will be given to students who take prior permission from the Principal)



- 52. Students absent from any examinations will be considered to have failed. Re-exams or tests will not be conducted for absent students.
- 53. There will be neither anticipation nor postponement of any examination to suit the convenience of a student or parent.
- 54. Written application for the verification of marks in special cases will be entertained at the discretion of the Principal, if accompanied with a search fee of Rs. 100/- per paper. Answer papers of the final examination will not be available for inspection by students/parents.

BEHAVIOUR NOT ACCEPTED IN THE SCHOOL PREMISES

- 55. Don Bosco Hr. Sec. School campus is a Tobacco Free Campus. Tobacco in any form, alcohol and other intoxicating substances / drugs is forbidden within the school campus. A student is liable to be suspended or dismissed if he / she is found possessing / using such substances.
- 56. No students, teachers or any organizations shall organize or conduct any activity, competition, picnic, exposure trips, games for Don Bosco students without prior permission of the school authorities. Violation of this rule will result in suspension or expulsion as per the seriousness of the situation.
- 57. Students are not allowed to collect money or raise funds for any purpose (picnic, class or club events) in



the name of the school without the express permission of the Principal. Students are not allowed to form any authority as a body. Such combined action is subversive of good order. Students may not address public meetings, social media, take part in the school competitions, participate in live/photographic modeling, Fashion shows, stage shows, talk shows or television programme using the name of school without the prior permission of the Principal.

- 58. The school does not permit student unions.
- 59. Neither buying / selling nor exchanging of goods, products etc. is allowed in the school. Students indulging in such action may be suspended or expelled.
- 60. Students are not allowed to bring any fancy /harmful items (Knifes, fire crackers, toy guns). Applying any glittering powder at each other or splashing water on each other in the class or in the school campus is strictly prohibited. Serious action will be taken if anyone breaks this rule.
- 61. Eating, chewing and drinking water inside the class room during class hours is prohibited.

WITHDRAWAL AND EXPULSION

62. Students are liable to be dismissed at any time of the year for their irregular attendance, insubordination, habitual idleness, disobedience and conduct affecting the morale of the school, unless the student corrects himself / herself after having been admonished.



- 63. A student may be asked to leave if he / she is suffering from any disease which would be harmful to the other fellow students.
- 64. A student is liable to be suspended or dismissed for any misbehaviour of a serious nature that has become public knowledge, even if it has taken place outside the school premises.
- 65. A student is liable to be suspended or dismissed for any act of indiscipline, insubordination, interference in administration or for disrespect to any member of the staff or any religion or community unless the student corrects himself / herself after having been admonished.
- 66. Students are forbidden to bring explosives / fireworks / ink / colour, dangerous implements / knives / pistols etc and toys to the school. Exemplary disciplinary action will be taken against students disobeying this rule. The student may be asked to discontinue for the well being of the school and its members, if necessary
- 67. The Principal will ask a student to take T.C. whose conduct is harmful to others or whose Parents/ Guardians show little or no interest in the student's progress.
- 68. Immorality, insubordination, contempt for authority, lack of interest in one's duties as a student and misappropriation of others belongings will be sufficient reasons for the suspension of a student.



SCHOOL UNIFORM

69. It is compulsory for every child to come to the school on all class days and at school functions neatly dressed in the school uniform. Student's ID card is part of the school uniform. Every student will wear the uniform as follows:-

Primary School (Class 1-4)

Daily Uniform: Black pants, White shirt, school belt & tie, Black laced shoes, school socks.

For Girls: Black Skirt, Red ribbon/black hair band for girls with short hair.

High School (Class 5-10)

Daily Uniform: Black pants, White shirt, school belt & tie, Black laced shoes, school socks.

For Girls: Red ribbon/ black hair band for girls with short hair

Higher Secondary School (Class 11-12)


Daily Uniform: Dark Blue pants, Light Blue shirt, school belt & tie, Black laced shoes, black socks.

For Girls: Red ribbon/black hair band for girls with short hair

- 71. By The Commissioner of Education, Government of Manipur: Students wearing School Uniforms are not allowed to loiter during school hours in and around places other than their School Campus without proper guidance/School staff.
- 72. Students shall wear their school uniform along with School Identity Card while they are in the school and for other school related activities.
- 73. A student who comes to the school without his/her complete uniform will not be allowed in the class room and may be sent home.
- 74. A student will approach the Principal only in full uniform on class days.
- 75. No fashionable item to be worn by the student in the school. Such items may be confiscated by the school authority
- 76. Students should be clean, their hair well groomed and neatly dressed in their uniform. Colouring of the hair, etc are not allowed in the school. Anyone violating this rule, shall be suspended. Long nails, use of nail polish, lips stick, hair dyes etc are not allowed in the school. Writing or tattooing on any part of the body shall result in suspension.





- 77. Don Bosco students should wear school uniform for any function in the school or while representing the school for any function outside.
- 78. BOYS: The following styles are forbidden for boys: Long hair, hair dye, gel & punk hair style, skinny or low hip pants, hugging shirts, bangles, chains, earrings, nail polish, Tattoo of any sort, etc. Boys should have a decent hair style that is neither too long nor too short.
- 79. GIRLS: The following styles are forbidden for girls: Lip-sticks/gloss, mascara, contact lens except with doctors prescription, eye-liner/kajal, fancy earrings, not more than one earring on each ear, nose-rings, bangles, chains, clips, cosmetics, nail polish, long nails, coloured hair etc.

LIBRARY

- 80. Students of class XI to XII are allowed to borrow books from the library.
- 81. Books are issued from the library to those who present their ID cards and only one book at a time will be borrowed by a student.
- 82. Books may be retained not more than 10 days, counted from the day of issuing.
- 83. If the student wishes to keep it longer, she/he should bring the book to library and renew.



- 84. Those who loose or damage the book in anyway will have to pay the full cost of the book with a fine of Rs. 50/-.
- 85. Check the book at the time of borrowing. If any damage is noticed, bring it to the notice of the librarian immediately. Thereafter no complaints will be entertained.
- 86. Students are required to maintain strict discipline and silence during the library period and should leave the books in the proper order on completion of the library period. They should not disturb other classes.
- 87. If for some reason or other, books cannot be returned on time, the student concerned must intimate the same to the librarian in writing.
- 88. Magazines and reference books are not allowed to be taken out of the library.
- 89. No one is allowed to take or return books with another's ID card. No students shall exchange the library books with each other.

NOTES TO THE PARENTS / GUARDIANS

Parents and guardians are not allowed to see their children or interview teachers during school hours.

Parents found threatening and/or manhandling the staff or other's children in and outside the school no matter what the fault may be, will find their own children dismissed from the school at the end of the year.





Parents retain their rights and duties in the education of their children even though they delegate them in part to the school. The support and collaboration of parents / guardians are in all cases considered indispensable to the success of the work of education carried out by the school.

Hence parents and guardians are requested to co¬operate with the school authorities:

By inculcating in their wards regular and punctual attendance.

By providing enough uniforms (at least two) and sending their wards to school, dressed daily in their proper and full uniform.

By seeing that their wards are diligent at their home work and lessons.

By insisting on neatness and cleanliness in their text books, exercise books and personal appearance.

By occasionally interviewing the Principal to discuss the progress of their children.

By occasionally looking through the Regularity Record section of this calendar.

By countersigning the Report Book, Handbook, etc.

By coming to the school when called for like functions, meetings and parents call, especially pertaining to students' welfare and betterment.


